

## 2024 DISC 3 Bridges Fiasco

## Notice of Race

## Entry Fee: \$10

**Details:** The Daingerfield Island Sailing Club (DISC) will sponsor the DISC 3 Bridges Fiasco Race at the Washington Sailing Marina.

Dates: Saturday July 13, 2024

**Rules:** This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing. US prescriptions will apply except where modified by the NOR and SI's.

**Eligibility:** By racing, each boat owner/skipper agrees to abide by the current Racing Rules of Sailing PHRF of the Chesapeake fleet rules, one design class rules, with exceptions for the use of electronic timing devices, VHF radios, and crew limits, the Notice of Race (NOR), and the DISC Sailing Instructions (SI). Each PHRF entry should meet US Sailing SER "Near Shore" where applicable. One Design boats under 20 ft. should meet their class safety rules. The boat owner is not required to be onboard or to helm. PHRF entries must have a valid 2024 PHRF of the Chesapeake certificate. Each representative must register online at <u>www.discsailing.org</u> under the events tab for the race by 1800 July 12, pay regatta fees, and all participants must sign all waivers.

**Communication:** Radio communication will be on VHF channel 69, all communications will be a courtesy. Failure to receive or understand a radio communication will not be considered as grounds for Redress. No competitor may send or receive communication that is not available to all competitors. This modifies RRS 62.1.

**Notices:** The DISC Official Notice Board is electronic and is located at <u>www.discsailing.org</u>, under the events tab for this race. Notices will be posted electronically until 2300 June 24, 2022, on race day the Official Notice Board will be outside the marina office.

**Schedule:** There will be a mandatory skippers meeting at 0930 outside the marina store at Washington Sailing Marina. There will be an opportunity to synchronize timing devises at the meeting.

Rendezvous: At 1045 in the vicinity of R4, near the City of Alexandria rowing facility.

**Classes:** Boats may participate in the Spinnaker, Non-spinnaker, and/or one design fleets if 5 or more boats are present in that class. If less than 5 boats of a single class are present, the boats will be scored using a Portsmouth rule.

**Start and Finish:** There will be no start before 1100. This will be a pursuit style start, each competitor will be assigned a starting time. Each competitor is responsible for knowing their start time, and starting correctly. The start/finish line will be between the orange flag on the race committee boat, or the mast, and R4. Each boat should record the boats finishing before and after them when possible. Competitors may start and finish in either direction. Competitors shall be on their start side of the line 1 minute before their start and not cross until their time to start.

**Scoring:** Any handicap system using Portsmouth Yardstick combined with PHRF of the Chesapeake ratings will be used to assign ratings to boats without a valid PHRF certificate. Low Point (Appendix A4 RRS) will be used. Boats will be scored in their order of finish.

**Time Limit:** 4 hours per race. This can be extended by the Race Committee based on conditions at the time.

**Protests:** Protests must be made in accordance with the current RRS. In addition, a boat must notify DISC officers of a protest at officers@discsailing.org by the Protest Time Limit. A time will be set for the hearing.

Protest time limit: One hour after the last boat finishes.

Insurance: All entries must be properly insured.

Awards: Bragging rights will be used as trophies.

**Facilities:** Three 1 ton cranes and two launch ramps are available for launch and recovery. Some limited wet slips may be available through Washington Sailing Marina, 1 Marina Drive, Alexandria, Virginia.

Waiver: All competitors will be required to sign a waiver for their respective clubs.

**Courses:** The course will be announced at the skippers' meeting. Marks can be rounded in any order, the RC may use different courses for Spinnaker and Non-spinnaker fleets. For light wind conditions other DISC courses may be selected. All courses are listed under Racing Resources at <u>www.discsailing.org</u>.

Marks to be rounded:

Course 1. Start at R4 in either direction, R2A just north of the Wilson Bridge rounded to port R4A south of the Anacostia Bridge rounded to port R4G off of Potomac Park rounded to port GR-HP rounded between R4A and R4G in either direction

G9 off of Giesboro Pt is a mark of the course when transiting north and south and will be passed in both directions on the channel side. It is also a rounding mark between R4A and R4G and can be rounded in either direction.

Course 2. Start at R4 in either direction, R2A just north of the Wilson Bridge rounded to port R4A south of the Anacostia Bridge rounded to port R2G off of Potomac Park rounded to port GR-HP off Haines Point, rounding mark between R4A and R2G off Potomac Park, can be rounded in either direction.

G9 off of Giesboro Pt is a mark of the course when transiting north and south and will be passed in both directions on the channel side.
