2024 Offshore Wolftrap Race (Distance Series)

Sailing Instruction (SIs) Addendum

1. DESCRIPTION

- **1.1** This event will consist of one race for PHRF (A, B, C, NON-SPIN, CC) sailboats holding a valid PHRF of the Chesapeake certificate, one-design classes, and cruising class sailboats having a provisional handicap rating assigned by FBYC. PHRF NON-SPIN will be sailed allowing only one (1) headsail downwind. This race is the fifth race in the Long Distance Series.
- 1.2 This SI Addendum supplements, and/or replaces where noted, the 2024 Offshore Sailing Instructions posted on the FBYC website www.fbyc.net/events/.

2. SAFETY

- **2.1** Sailboats shall comply with US Sailing "Safety Equipment Requirements" (SER) "Nearshore" category.
- **2.1.1** For **Distance Series Events** the additional SER requirements below will be required regardless of class rules:

SER 2.5.1, Bilge Pump

SER 2.7.2, Propulsion (4 hour min)

SER 3.22, Wood plugs

SER 3.24.1, Searchlight

SER 3.26, Radar reflector

SER 3.27.1, Two buckets with lanyards

SER 3.32, Cockpit knife

SER 3.35, No aloft halyards

SER 3.36, Boom support

3. SCHEDULE OF RACES

3.1 The time of the first Warning Signal for this race will be at 1100 hours

4. STARTING AREA

- **4.1** The Committee Boat could be anywhere from Piankatank R. G "5" (FBYC "A"), to the yellow tetrahedron drop mark (FBYC "B") or beyond.
- **4.2** The **Starting Line** shall be between Piankatank R. FI G 4s 15ft 4M "5" (FBYC "A" and the orange flag on a Race Committee Boat stationed north to west of FBYC "A".
- **5. COURSE** (This replaces 2024 Offshore Sl's, 6.1, 6.2b&c)
- **5.1** The course to be sailed will be designated by letters and numbers displayed on a Race Committee boat or in the Sailing Instructions. See Appendices A and B (https://www.fbyc.net/sailing-documents/appendix/) for designation of government and special marks used in setting courses.
 - **5.1.1** The Race Committee may select from the "pre-defined Alphabetic" courses listed below, or, in the event of inclement conditions, the RC may set an alternate government mark course using Mark Designations as found in Appendix A.
- **5.2** The first mark of the course **may** be (1) special buoy "Y", or (2) a government mark listed in Appendix A. See Offshore SI 6.2(d) for course display format. After rounding the first mark of the course, yachts shall sail the remaining marks of the appropriate course as set forth below.

If no additional first mark is specified, yachts shall sail the marks of the appropriate course as set forth below. FBYC "A" will be the Finish Mark for all courses.

For this course, an additional mark "MH1" at Milford Haven Inlet will be honored. MH1 is a green permanent daybeacon located at N37°27.376' W76°12.737'. All skippers are advised to familiarize themselves with the shallows near mark "MH1" and plan all mark approaches and departures accordingly when honoring this mark of the course.

- 6. THE FINISH (replaces Sec 11.0, The Finish, of 2023 Offshore Sailing Instructions)
- 6.1. The **finish line** shall be between Piankatank R. FI G 4s 15ft 4M "5" (FBYC "A") and the blue flag on a Race Committee Boat stationed north of FBYC "A".

- 6.2 A boat approaching the finish at night must show a white light when no less than ½ mile away from the finish line to call attention to her presence and when crossing the finish line to illuminate her racing or sail numbers. An ordinary flashlight is not acceptable for this purpose.
- 6.3 If a Race Committee Boat is not on station at the finish, finishing boats must leave FBYC "A" to port by no more than 25 yards, and record their own time when FBYC "A" bears 180 degrees magnetic from the helmsman's position, and, if possible, record the names, sail numbers and approximate finish times of the boats finishing immediately ahead and behind.
 - 6.3.1 All competitors reporting their own finish will notify RC of their finish by their boat name, sail number, GPS finish time and names of boats finishing before or after. This information should be texted to 804-999-4488 within 1 hour of finishing the race.

7. TIME LIMIT

7.1 The time limit for the first boat in any class or subclass to finish the courses shall be eight (8) hours.

Boats failing to finish within two (2) hours of the first boat within any class or subclass will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF) without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4, and A5.

- 8. PROTESTS (replaces Sec 12.0, Protests, of 2023 Offshore Sailing Instructions)
- 8.1 A boat wishing to protest will notify RC by texting to 804-999-4488 with:
- (a) their intent to protest, (b) the boat being protested, and (c) the rule believed to have been broken, within 2 hours of the last boat finishing. Protests will be coordinated and heard at a time after the protest time limit has expired, but within 48 hours of the start of the race.
- **8.2** Appendix T will be in effect Arbitration
- **8.3** Breaches of instructions, 15.1 or specified requirements in the Event Notice will not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes Rules 60.1(a) and 61.2.

9. CBYRA SANCTION

9.1 This race is sanctioned for CBYRA High Point awards.
