

Sailing Instructions

J/24 District 10, Fleet 86

1 RULES

The regatta will be governed by the Rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the notice board located on the first floor of the DIYC clubhouse.

3 CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted by the conclusion of the Competitors meeting.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Flag AP with two sounds (one sound when lowered) means "The race is postponed. The warning signal will be made not less than 30min after AP is lowered."

5 SCHEDULE

Saturday July 13, 2024

- 0900 Registration, Check In
- 1000 Competitors' Meeting
- 1200 Warning signal for 1st race of the day

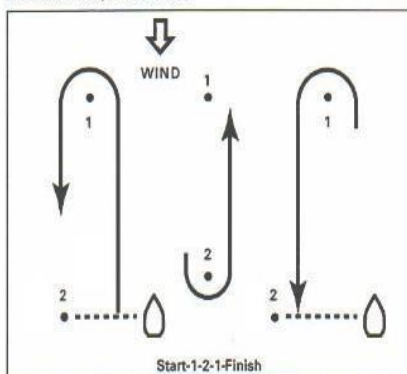
Sunday July 14, 2024

- 1000 Warning signal for 1st race of the day
- 1300 No warning signal after this time

6 COURSES AND MARKS

- 6.1 The courses will be windward/leeward with 4 legs as shown below.

Windward / Leeward



- 6.2 Marks 1 and 2 will be yellow inflatables. Mark 2 will

also be a starting mark and a finishing mark.

7 THE START AND FINISH

- 7.1 Appendix U – Audible Signal Racing System will be used. No flags will be used.
- 7.2 The RC may invoke a starting penalty of RRS 30 by flag or hail.
- 7.3 No boat may start more than 3 minutes after the starting signal.
- 7.4 The start/finish line will be a staff on the RC vessel displaying an orange (blue for finish) flag and the course side of a nearby mark.

8 TIME LIMIT

The time limit for the first boat to sail the course and finish is 60 minutes.

9 HEARING REQUESTS

- 9.1 Competitors involved in protests must report to the RC within 20 minutes after the signal boat docks. Failure to report by the protestor will result in the protest being disallowed. Failure to report by the protestee will result in the protest being heard without him.
- 9.2 Written protests are not required, unless requested by the protestee.

10 SCORING

Seven races are scheduled. A minimum of one race constitutes a regatta. If five or more races are sailed, a boat's worst score shall be discarded.

11 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded at the Organizing Authority's discretion.

12 RADIO COMMUNICATION

The race committee will use VHF channel 72 to communicate with the fleet.

13 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 13.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 3, Decision to Race.

13.2 The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
