

# NOTICE OF RACE/Sailing Instructions

Clearwater Green Fleet Open

## 1. RULES

- 1.1 The event shall be governed by the rules defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)
- 1.2 No national authority prescriptions will apply.
- 1.3 The class rules of the participating classes will apply as amended by the sailing instructions.
- 1.4 If there is a conflict between this Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions, the Sailing instructions will take precedence.

## 2. ELIGIBILITY and ENTRY

Classes eligible for entry include Optimist Green

## 3. FEES

- 3.1 The entry fee for adult competitors is **\$100** if received by 2359 Est September 29th.
- 3.2 After 23:59 September 29th a \$5 late fee will be added.

## 4. SCHEDULE

### Saturday October 5th

- 0800 Check In
- 0930 Competitors meeting
- 1000 First possible warning signal
- 1600 Last possible warning signal

### Sunday October 6th

- 1000 first possible warning
- 1400 last possible warning signal
- Awards as soon as possible after racing

## 5. Format

Saturday will be normal course racing around a triangle windward leeward. If races are scored Saturday and weather allows Sunday morning will start with a 'Clearwater Challenge' round the islands race. The Clearwater Challenge race will be scored as one course race.

## 6. MEASUREMENT

It is the responsibility of each competitor that his/her equipment conforms to the IODA class rules.

## 7. Racing Area

Green Fleet racing will be held in Clearwater Harbor East of Clearwater Community Sailing Center.

## 8. Notices To Competitors

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board in the main entryway.

## 9. Changes to the Notice of Race/Sailing Instructions

Any changes to the Notice of Race/Sailing Instructions will be posted no later than 60 minutes before the first warning signal for the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of racing will be posted no later than 2100 the night before it will take effect.

## 10. Signals Made ashore

- 10.1 All signals made ashore will be displayed on the official flag pole in the center of CCSC boat park.
- 10.2 When Flag AP is displayed ashore '1 minute' is replaced by 'not less than 20 minutes' in race signal AP.

## 11. Class Flags

Green fleet class flag will be a green flag with green flames.

## 12. Courses

Green fleet will sail a triangle windward leeward course as described in appendix A for all course races, for the marathon race course CC will be used and is described in appendix B

## 13. Marks

Mark 1,3 will be a orange tetrahedron, Mark2 will be a green tetrahedron, Start/finish pin will be a yellow cylinder

## 14. The Start

14.1 All races will be started as follows

14.2 The start line will be between the staff displaying an orange flag and a yellow cylinder.

## 15. The Finish

The finishing line is between a staff displaying a blue flag and a yellow cylinder.

## 16. Time limits

16.1 The race time limit will be 30 minutes, and the finishing window will be 20 minutes.

## 17. SCORING

17.1 One race is required to be completed to constitute a regatta.

17.2(a) When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

(b) When 5 to 11 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

## 16. Prizes

Awards shall be given to the overall top 5.

## 17. Safety/Check out System

17.1 Sailors shall check out before they enter the water by putting their organizer supplied lanyard on the 'on the water board'.

17.2 Sailors shall check back in as soon as possible upon returning to shore by removing their lanyard from the 'on the water board'.

17.3 A US Coast Guard approved PFD shall be worn by all competitors and coaches.

## 18. Support Teams

18.1 Coaches are expected to be good role models for young sailors and conduct themselves accordingly ashore and on the water.

18.2 All support boat helmsman shall wear a kill cord at all times while operating their vessel. Violation of this may be grounds for expulsion from the event.

18.3 Coaching the back half of green fleet is encouraged.

18.4 Non coaching support vessels shall stay out of the racing area.

## 19 RISK STATEMENT

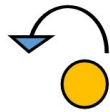
19.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, or other causes.

16.2 The organizing authority including the sponsors, the race committee, the officers, directors, employees and members of the Clearwater Community Sailing Center and all those involved in these organizations will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the event. An online waiver shall be signed by all competitors and their parent/guardian.

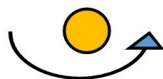
