



2024 ILCA Series Sailing Instructions – Including Amendment 1

The notation [DP] means that the penalty for a breach of the rule, may at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than DSQ.

The notation [NP] in a rule means it shall not be grounds for protest by another boat. This changes rule 60.1(a).

1 RULES

As described in the Notice of Race.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the electric official notice board located on Regatta Network:

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Changes to the sailing instruction will be posted on the electronic official notice board on Regatta Network at: <http://www.regattanetwork.com/event/28117> by 1200 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 the day before it will take effect.

3.2 In accordance with RRS 90.2(c), the race committee may give oral changes to the sailing instructions, on-the-water. Should this be deemed necessary, the race committee shall display the "L" flag on the signal boat with one sound, prior to making oral announcements.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed, or communicated verbally, at the Lake Forest Launch Ramp.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.1 Races will be on Monday evenings with two, 7-evening series as follows:

(Spring series - 7 weeks)	5/27 through 7/8	First warning 1800
(Spring makeup day – if required)	Tuesday 7/19	First warning 1800
(Summer series – 7 weeks)	7/15 through 8/26	First warning 1800
(Summer makeup day – if required)	Tuesday 8/27	First warning 1700

5.2 Three races are scheduled each evening, although more races may be run should conditions permit.

5.3 Warning signals for second and subsequent races will be made as soon as practical after completion of each race.

5.4 When racing is concluded each evening, the race committee will display AP over A to signal that: *races not started are postponed. No more racing today.*

6 CLASS FLAGS

Class flags will be as follows. Multiple classes may start simultaneously, in which case the race committee will display multiple class flags:

6.1 Class	Flag
ILCA A Fleet	White numeral "1" on a black field
ILCA B Fleet	White numeral "2" on a black field
RS Zest	White numeral "3" on a black field
Melges 15	White numeral "4" on a black field

6.2 For ILCA A and B fleets, either a full-rig or radial sail may be selected for any race.

7 RACING AREAS

The racing area will be near the Tahoe City PUD Lake Forest Boat Ramp located approximately two miles northeast of Tahoe City.

8 THE COURSES AND MARKS

8.1 See Addendum A for course illustrations.

8.2 After starting and before finishing, boats shall not cross the starting-finishing line. During this time, the starting-finishing line is defined as an obstruction. Boats breaking this SI may take a Two-Turns Penalty, as described in RRS 44.2, and continue racing.

9 THE START

9.1 Races will be started using RRS Appendix U (Audible-Signal Racing System).

9.2 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange or red flag on the race committee signal boat and a round red/orange buoy.

9.3 A boat that starts later than four minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS. This changes rule 35.

9.4 Boats whose warning signal has not been made are requested to keep clear of the starting area during the starting sequence for other classes, and while boats are finishing. [NP] [DP]

10 RECALLS

The race committee may hail the sail number(s) of the boat(s) identified on the course side of the starting line after the starting signal. The failure of a hail, the failure of a boat to hear the hail, or the order of the hails shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

11 CHANGING THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

The race committee may change the position of the next mark in accordance with rule 33. However, changes of less than 15° in direction and .2 nm in range may not be signaled. This changes rule 33.

12 THE FINISH

The finishing line is the same as the starting line.

13 TIME LIMIT

Boats failing to finish within 10 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored DNF without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4, and A5.

14 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

14.1 Boats intending to protest or request redress are requested to notify the PRO, including the sail number(s) of the boat(s) being protested, following the race in which the incident occurred.

Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be emailed to the TYC not later than noon on Tuesday following the race.

14.3 When protests are filed, the protest meeting schedule will be posted on Regatta Network not later than 1500 hours on Thursday following the race. Hearings are normally scheduled on Thursday evening at the TYC clubhouse.

15 SCORING

15.1 Twenty-one (21) races are scheduled for each series although more may be conducted. Five (5) completed races are required to constitute a series.

15.2 As many races as possible may be run each day.

15.3 If fewer than five races are completed, a boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores. For every five races completed, one race score shall be discarded.

15.4 For each race, boats that do not come to the starting area, do not start, do not finish, retire, or are disqualified, shall be scored one more than the number of boats that come to the starting area. This replaces RRS A9.

16 SAFETY

When reasonably possible, boats shall notify the RC when retiring from the racecourse. [NP] [DP]

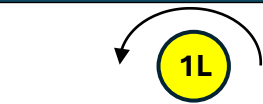

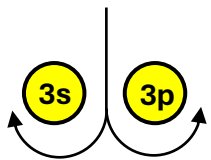

If yellow flag displayed under class flag, mark 1L replaces mark 1.

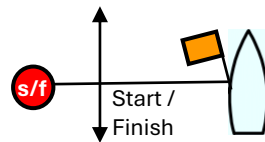
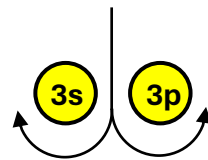
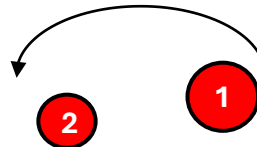

If yellow flag displayed under class flag, mark 1L replaces mark 1.

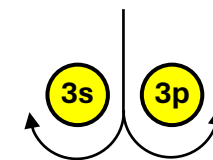
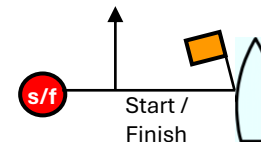
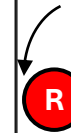
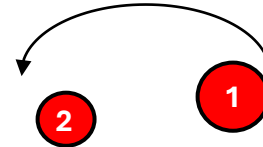

D7 Offset mark (2) and s/f pin - round balls. WW mark 1 - red cone. WW mark 1L - yellow cone. Gates will be red cones or yellow cylinders. All port roundings except gates and mark HA (course 7). If one gate mark is missing, round the remaining mark to port. Offset mark (2) may or may not be set.
