



2024 Dick Ferris Beer Can Series Sailing Instructions - Including Amendment 1 and 2

The notation [DP] means that the penalty for a breach of the rule, may at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than DSQ.
The notation [NP] in a rule means it shall not be grounds for protest by another boat. This changes rule 60.1(a).

1 RULES

As described in the Notice of Race.

2 COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the electronic official notice board located on Regatta Network at: <http://www.regattanetwork.com/event/28118>.
- 2.2 The race committee intends to communicate with boats on VHF channel 65.

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Changes to the sailing instruction will be posted on the electronic official notice board on Regatta Network at: <http://www.regattanetwork.com/event/28118> by 1200 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 the day before it will take effect.

4 NO SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

No signals will be made ashore.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 Races will be on Wednesday evening with two 7-night series as follows:

- 5.2 Two races are scheduled each evening. The race committee may attempt to conduct a third race if conditions permit.
- 5.3 Warning signals for second and subsequent races will be made as soon as practical after completion of the previous race.
- 5.4 When racing is concluded each evening, the race committee will display AP over A to signal that: *races not started are postponed. No more racing today.*

6 CLASS FLAGS

Class flags will be black numbers on a white field. Multiple classes may start simultaneously, in which case the race committee will display multiple class flags:

<u>Class</u>	<u>Flag</u>
Division 1 Keelboats (PHRF < 49)	Black numeral "1" on a white field
Division 2 (Non-sprit boats PHRF >48 and <96) (and sprit boats PHRF >48 and <118) (except Beneteau 10Rs)	Black numeral "2" on a white field

7 RACING AREAS

The racing area will be between Dollar Point and Tahoe Tavern.

8 COURSES AND MARKS

8.1 See Addendum A for course illustrations. This is a new course illustration sheet.

8.2 All marks shall be left to port except gates (3s/3p) and mark HA in course 7.

8.3 A windward offset mark (mark 2) may or may not be set.

8.4 After starting and before finishing, boats shall not cross the start-finish line. Boats breaking this SI may take a Two-Turns Penalty, as described in rule 44.2, and continue racing.

8.5 If a yellow flag is displayed under the class flag, mark 1L (long windward mark) replaces mark 1.

9 THE START

9.1 Races will be started using rule 26.

9.2 The race committee may start divisions in any order.

9.3 The warning signal for the second and subsequent class will be made with or after the starting signal for the preceding class.

9.4 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee signal boat and a round red/orange buoy.

9.5 A boat that starts later than four minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS. This changes rule 35.

9.6 Boats whose warning signal has not been made are requested to keep clear of the starting area during the starting sequence for other classes, and while boats are finishing. [NP] [DP]

10 RECALLS

The race committee may hail the sail number(s) of the boat(s) identified on the course side of the starting line at the starting signal, on VHF. The failure of a hail, the failure of a boat to hear the hail, or the order of the hails shall not be grounds for redress. This changes rule 62.1(a).

11 CHANGING THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

The race committee may change the position of the next mark in accordance with rule 33. However, changes of less than 15° in direction and .2 nm in range may not be signaled. This changes rule 33.

12 THE FINISH

The finishing line is the same as the starting line.

13 TIME LIMIT

13.1 The time limit for finishing a race shall be 90 minutes.

13.2 Boats failing to finish within 15 minutes after the first boat, in respective class, sails the course and finishes will be scored DNF without a hearing. This changes rules 35, A4, and A5.

14 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

14.1 Boats intending to protest or request redress shall notify the PRO, including the sail number(s) of the boat(s) being protested, following the race in which the incident occurred.

Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be emailed to the Protest Committee Chairman not later than noon on Thursday following the race.

14.3 When protests are filed, the protest meeting schedule will be posted on Regatta Network not later than 1500 hours on Thursday following the race. Hearings are normally scheduled on Thursday evening at the TYC clubhouse.

15 SCORING

15.1 Fourteen (14) races are scheduled for the Spring Series and fourteen (14) races are scheduled for the Summer Series. Five (5) completed races are required to constitute each series.

15.2 If fewer than five races are completed, a boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores. For every five races completed, one race score shall be excluded.

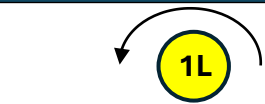
15.3 For each race, boats that do not come to the starting area, do not start, do not finish, retire, do not sail the course, or are disqualified (including DSQs, BFDs, UFDs, OCSs), shall be scored one more than the number of boats that finish the race. This changes the first sentence of rule A5.2.

16 SAFETY

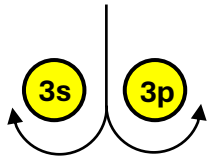
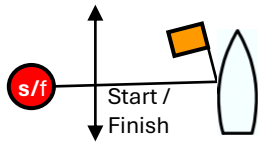
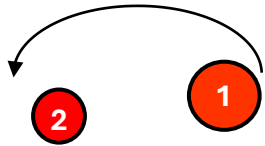
When reasonably possible, boats are requested to notify the RC when retiring from the racecourse.

If yellow flag displayed under class flag, mark 1L replaces mark 1.

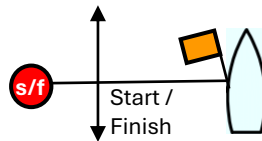
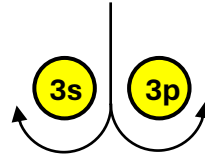
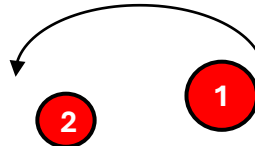

If yellow flag displayed under class flag, mark 1L replaces mark 1.

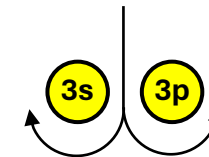
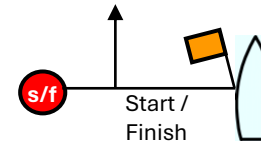
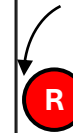
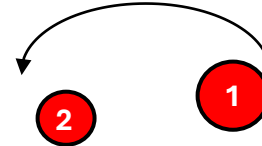

D7 Offset mark (2) and s/f pin - round balls. WW mark 1 - red cone. WW mark 1L - yellow cone. Gates will be red cones or yellow cylinders. All port roundings except gates and mark HA (course 7). If one gate mark is missing, round the remaining mark to port. Offset mark (2) may or may not be set.
