Emergency or Life-Threatening Injury - Steps

- 1. Render assistance
- 2. Make contact with Safety Officer, Race PRO, Race committee boats, coaches, and/or Emergency Teams (FWC, USCG, USCG Aux, Sea Tow) for direction/assistance
- 3. Call for Help & Emergency Medical Attention VHF Ch 23A: (Contact Safety Officer, Race PRO, FWC, USCG, USCG Auxiliary, or Key Largo Fire on site). If VHF contact fails, call 911 or hail on VHF Ch 16,

- 4. Monitor and administer first-aid to the level of your training. If needed transport participant to dockside location to meet on site medics.
- 5. Safety Officer stay with participant/medics and assign a person to meet/direct Emergency vehicles at gate of Rowell's Waterfront Park.
- 6. Medics on scene (KL Fire) transfer/transport injured participant to care of EMS Team.
- 7. Contact family of injured participant.
- 8. Complete an incident report.

- Where you plan to bring injured person ashore (see below)
- Age/gender/number of injured people
- Type of injury/situation
- Your name and call back number

Emergency or Life-Threatening Injury - Steps

- 1. Render assistance
- 2. Make contact with Safety Officer, Race PRO, Race committee boats, coaches, and/or Emergency Teams (FWC, USCG, USCG Aux, Sea Tow) for direction/assistance.
- 3. Make Emergency call on 23A for assistance. No KL Fire on site due to stations proximity to UKSC. May be more efficient to transport via water to Rowell's Waterfront Park. COMMUNICATE. If not communication established on VHF 23A, call 9-1-1.
- 4. Call for Help & Emergency Medical Attention VHF Ch 23A: (Contact Safety Officer, Race PRO, FWC, USCG, or USCG Auxiliary). If VHF contact fails, call 911 or hail on VHF Ch 16.

- 6. Safety Officer stay with participant and assign a person to meet/direct Emergency vehicles from UKSC front gate to concrete dock pick up location.
- 7. EMS transfer/transport injured participant.
- 8. Contact family of injured participant.
- 9. Complete an incident report.
