Notice of Races

Registration: Boats may enter by registering and paying for each series at the website.

The entry fee is \$0. Registration is due by 1800 on the date of the first race. Late registrations will be accepted until 1800 on the date of the last

race, but boats will not be scored for previous races.

Race Area: Course charts are published on the website. The course selection will be

made at the skippers' meeting.

Classes: All competitors will compete in a single class. Spinnakers will not be used

unless all competitors present at the skippers' meeting unanimously agree to allow spinnakers. The choice to use spinnakers will apply only to that

night's race.

Eligibility: The event is open to boats 20 feet or longer. All entries must have a

current PHRF of the Chesapeake rating certificate. (Exception: a boat without a valid PHRF rating certificate may be assigned a provisional

rating at DISC's discretion.)

All boats must be crewed by a minimum of two people (skipper plus one additional crewmember). Skippers must be current members of DISC. All

skippers and crew must sign DISC's waiver of liability, found on the

website.

All PHRF participants must meet US Sailing Near-shore requirements, as listed at www.ussailing.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/01/Monohull-SER-2022.0-Nearshore.pdf. All boats must be equipped with lights for night

sailing. PHRF boats must be self-righting.

Scoring: Boats will be scored using time-on-time and CR ratings. Scoring will be in

accordance with RRS Appendix A, based on the "low point" system in RRS A4. Three scored races will constitute a sailed series. A boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores, except that when at least

five races have been scored, a series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. A "DSQ" issued as a result of a protest decision shall be scored as "DNE" (disqualification that is not excludable). A boat serving as RC will receive a score for that race that is the average of her scores for the series.

With regard to boats that register but do not race, RRS A5.3 applies.

Notices:

The DISC notice board is online. Ashore, DISC may send notices by website posts, email, or text messages. A DISC officer or representative will brief any last-minute notices at the skippers' meeting.

Rules:

This event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), including the Course Charts on the website, this Notice of Race, Sailing Instructions, and amendments. If there is a conflict, the Sailing Instructions take precedence.

RRS 32, 44, 60, 61, and S4.1 are modified as described in the Sailing Instructions.

Liability:

RRS 3 states, "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone." By participating in this event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform, and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes. By participating in this event, each competitor accepts the Waiver of Liability on the website.

Insurance: Each participating boat must be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with minimum coverage of \$500,000 per incident or equivalent.

Weather:

If DISC decides to cancel the race, it will post a notice on the online notice board. If crews have already gathered at WSM, a DISC officer (or representative) will announce the cancellation at the skippers' meeting.

Awards:

First, second, and third place trophies will be awarded for fleets of five or more; first and second place for fleets of four; and first place for fleets for three or less. Trophies will be presented at DISC's annual awards banquet.

Standing RC: The standing race committee (standing RC) is comprised of DISC's vice commodore, spinnaker fleet captain, non-spinnaker fleet captain, any DISC officers present, and any person appointed by the DISC officers. The standing RC may cancel or postpone a race, or make course selections based on conditions the day of the race.
